### John Huling McLean Orchestra

This morning we welcome John Huling, executive director of the McLean Orchestra.

Mr. Huling won the position of Assistant Principal Trombone with the National Symphony Orchestra in 1986 and retired from the NSO in 2007.

Between 1980 and 1986, Mr. Huling was a member of the Boston Pops Esplanade Orchestra and played regularly with the Boston Pops, Bos-

ton Symphony, and Boston Ballet orchestras.

From 1985 to 1986, Mr. Huling played with the San Diego Symphony Orchestra as its Acting Principal Trombone and also performed with the San Francisco Symphony.

Mr. Huling attended the New England Conservatory of Music in Boston on full scholarship and received his bachelor of music degree "with distinction" in 1980.

Mr. Huling spent 20 years on the faculties of The Catholic University of America and the University of Maryland as Adjunct Professor of Trombone.

## McAuliffe Sees Green Future for Automobiles

Terry McAuliffe, former head of the Democratic National Committee and co-chairman of President Bill Clinton's re-election campaign in 1996, wears a different hat these days — as an auto executive with a global vision.

Terry is chairman of GreenTech Automotive (GTA) in McLean, a company he helped found in 2006 that is now producing electric and

hybrid cars.

The company sold its first year's production to Denmark, and soon plans to sell cars in the United States and China.

GTA is building a second factory in Mississippi because that state recruits new businesses much more aggressively than does Virginia, he said. The company is also building a plant in China.
