

Today's Speaker

Benjamin G. Davis, Ph.D. University of North America

This morning we welcome Dr. Benjamin G. Davis, chancellor of the University of North America, who will speak about the state of higher education today.

The University of North America is a graduate university offering Master's and doctoral degrees in management, information technology, and computer science and a variety of certification programs in the United States, Hong Kong, and India.

Dr. Davis also holds an appointment as Ecumenical Institute Professor of Moral Theology at St. Mary's Seminary and University, where he has twice been named Dunning Dis-

tinguished Lecturer.

Dr. Davis serves as an Adjunct Professor of Space Studies at the American Public University System. He also is the author of the longrunning column "On Religion" published weekly in three newspapers.

An engineer by training, Dr. Davis left General Motors and shifted careers, serving with various humanitarian, religious, and educational institutions. In the academic world, he has held positions with the University of Phoenix, University of Northern Virginia, Potomac College, and Baltimore International College.

A self-described "perpetual student," Dr. Davis holds nine academic degrees, including two doctorates. He is a prolific author with two textbooks and more than 80 works to his credit.

Murder With a Twist

Our resident China expert Tim Long painted a fascinating picture of the political in-fighting behind the trial of a prominent Chinese official's wife accused of poisoning a British businessman. In his Aug. 9 talk, Tim explained that the trial of Gu Kailai is really an attempt by the political foes of her husband, Bo Xilai, to keep the recently ousted leader out of power.

[Editors' note: Gu was found guilty, as expected, in an eight-hour trial on Aug. 9. Sentencing will follow.]
