

Stephen S. Fuller, Ph.D. Center for Regional Analysis

This morning we welcome Stephen S. Fuller, Ph.D., professor of public policy and regional development at George Mason University. Prof. Fuller holds the Dwight Schar Faculty Chair and serves as director of GMU's Center for Regional Analysis. Prior to joining George Mason in 1994, he served on the faculty of George Washington University for 25 years.



Military Musical Chairs

The BRAC plan to relocate military personnel and facilities is having a negative impact on 72 office buildings and 8 million square feet of space in Fairfax and Arlington counties and Alexandria, according to Marianne Swearingen, research manager for commercial real estate group CBRE.

Speaking on March 7, Marianne said that Fort Belvoir will gain 22,000 personnel, but lacks adequate surrounding roads and mass transit to handle the influx. Tysons Corner should be largely unaffected by the shifts, she said.
