

# Stephanie Roessler, Ph.D. National Cancer Institute, NIH

This morning we are pleased to welcome back Stephanie Roessler, Ph.D., who will discuss a topic related to her cancer research, the future of personalized oncology treatment.

Since 2011, Stephanie has been a research fellow in the Laboratory of Human Carcinogenesis at the National Cancer Institute of the National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, Md. From 2006 to 2011, she served as a postdoctoral fellow in that laboratory.

In addition to her research, Stephanie has supervised Ph.D. and M.S. candidates in the United States and Germany, and taught college courses in immunology and microbiology in Germany. She has two patents pending.

Stephanie earned her doctorate, *magna cum laude*, from the Albert-Ludwigs-University of Freiburg, Germany, in 2006.
