

Today's Speaker Teresa Scanlan Miss America 2011

This morning we welcome Teresa Scanlan, Miss America 2011. The former Miss Nebraska was only 17 when she won the coveted national crown.

During her year as Miss America, Teresa traveled more than 150,000 miles, visiting 40 states and four countries as a performer, host, and speaker. She then released her first album of vocal and piano music in 2012 and continued to travel as a speaker and advocate for many causes.

Teresa and her three sisters recently founded Hearts Inside Out, a nonprofit that serves orphans in Haiti. She is also the official U.S. spokesperson for the humanitarian group Croatian Relief Services and serves on the board of Youth Service America.

Teresa now lives in Purcellville, where she is finishing her degree in government at Patrick Henry College.

Bruce McBarnette Wins National, World Masters Titles

Few Rotary clubs can boast a world champion among their ranks, but we're fortunate to have one at Tysons Corner.

Our own Bruce McBarnette is a world-class athlete and record holder who won two major championships in the month of March alone.

Bruce won the gold medal at the USA Masters Track and Field Championships in Boston on March 15, competing in the high jump for men 55-59. Bruce jumped 6 feet 1 inch (1.85 meters) and also took second in the triple jump the next day at 36 feet (10.94 meters).

This was his 28th time winning the high jump at a USA Masters Championship!

Only two weeks later, at the World Masters Track and Field Championships in Budapest, Hungary, Bruce again took gold in the high jump. Bruce, who is the current world record holder for his age group in this event, jumped 5 feet 8 inches (1.74 meters) on March 29 for his 11th win in a World Masters Championship.

Bruce beat out 26 competitors in a grueling three-hour competition at Syma Stadium in Budapest to take the world crown. "I felt honored to represent the United States," said Bruce, who started high jumping as a college freshman and never stopped.

Bruce already has his sights set on the national championships in Winston-Salem, N.C., this July, and the next world championships in Lyon, France, in August 2015.
