Monte Carlo Night Shows Revenue Gain

The Club's major fall fundraiser posted a significant gain in 2013 over the previous year – good news for local groups supported by the RCTC Foundation.

The 2013 Monte Carlo Night, a multi-club effort of the Tysons Corner, McLean, Arlington, and Dunn Loring-Merrifield Rotary clubs, showed overall net revenue of \$52,382 compared to \$31,952 in 2012, according to figures releases by event treasurer David Danner.

Of that amount, Tysons Corner netted \$15,033 compared to \$8,524 in 2012.

Tysons Corner revenue jumped sharply by 76 percent, outperforming the other three clubs. In contrast, the event showed an overall gain of 64 percent from the prior year.

Chairman Burt Heacock announced that the next Monte Carlo Night will take place on Nov. 7, 2014, at the Fairview Park Marriott once again.
