Today's Speaker Gerald Gordon, Ph.D. Fairfax County Economic

Today we welcome back Gerald L. Gordon, Ph.D., president and CEO of the Fairfax County Economic Development Authority (FCEDA). He has been with the FCEDA since late 1983.

Development Authority

Dr. Gordon has taught at the Catholic University of America,

University of Maryland, George Mason University, and Virginia Commonwealth University. He has also worked for Arlington County and the U.S. Department of Labor.

Dr. Gordon holds a bachelor's degree from The Citadel, a master's degree from George Washington University, and a doctorate in international economics from the Catholic University of America.

He is the author of 13 books and numerous articles on management topics.

Giving Back:

In his Jan. 30 talk, Captain Will Bailey tells an inspiring story of joining the Army to support six siblings, serving almost 23 years as a Fairfax County firefighter, raising two children by himself, and helping thousands more by organizing annual backpack, winter coat, and toy drives.



Working with the Club's communications chairman, Hunter created the TOWER TALK format in 2006. He rolled out the inaugural issue on March 9, 2006.

Hunter went on to write and design TOWER TALK every week by himself until the end of June 2008. By that time Hunter had published 106 issues, and was ready to let me take over in July. But he saw me struggling, and soon agreed to come back as the "typesetter" if I would do the writing. And thus our collaboration was born.

Of course "typesetter" didn't begin to describe the many hats he wore: photographer, designer, editor, ally. He was an engineer by training, but words were his playthings. He mastered the temperamental "Publisher" software and found ways to work around its quirks.

From Aug. 14, 2008, through today we produced 264 issues of TOWER TALK. We never missed a week – even if a meeting was canceled. No one was more dependable than Hunter. Between our output and his initial solo stint, Hunter produced a remarkable 370 issues of TOWER TALK – and won three first-place and one third-place District awards for "best bulletin" in the five years before the District dropped the contest.

This weekly journal has been his baby, and he's put his heart – and countless hours – into it.

Dave Young will carry on as Hunter's successor. But those 370 issues will stand as a testament to a Rotarian who has always cared deeply about this Club. I have loved working with Hunter and I'm going to miss our weekly forays. Thanks for a terrific run, my friend. You do good work. – *Rick Kaplar*
