Today's Speaker

Terry McAuliffe

Candidate for Governor

Today we welcome back Terry McAuliffe, Democratic candidate for governor of Virginia.

A businessman, politician, and fundraiser, Mr. McAuliffe served as chairman of the Democratic National Committee from 2001 to 2005. He served as co-chairman of President Clinton's 1996 re-election campaign and also served as chairman of Hillary Clinton's presidential campaign in 2008. He earned a reputation as a highly successful

fundraiser for Democratic candidates and the Democratic Party.

Mr. McAuliffe's business interests have included banking, real estate development, home building, hotels, and telecommunications. In 2006 he co-founded GreenTech Automotive Inc., a builder of hybrid and electric cars headquartered in McLean with production facilities in Mississippi. He spoke to our Club in September 2011 about this venture, but has since relinquished his chairmanship to run for governor.

A native of Syracuse, N.Y., Mr. McAuliffe received a bachelor's degree in 1979 from The Catholic University of America in Washington, and then joined the 1980 presidential re-election campaign of Jimmy Carter. After the campaign, he enrolled in Georgetown University Law Center and received his law degree in 1984. Mr. McAuliffe's 2007 memoir, *What a Party! My Life Among Democrats*, was a *New York Times* best seller.

Mr. McAuliffe and his wife, Dorothy, have three girls and two boys and have lived in Fairfax County for more than 20 years.

Locally, the Tysons Corner Rotary Club helps the youth and elderly of the community by supporting groups including Alternative House (for teenagers), Alzheimer's Family Day Center, and the Lewinsville and Pimmit Hills senior centers. The Club also awards college scholarships to graduates of local high schools.
