## Anne Abernathy Olympic Athlete

This morning we welcome Anne Abernathy, an Olympic athlete from the U.S. Virgin Islands. Anne most recently competed in the Torino Games in 2006, marking the sixth time she participated in luge events in Winter Olympic competition since she started in 1988.

Anne is the oldest female athlete to compete in the Winter Olympics
and now has her sights set on a new Olympic challenge: qualifying and competing in a new sport - archery - in the 2016 Summer Olympics in Rio.

Anne was a professional singer when she traveled to Lake Placid in the early 1980s and got hooked on the sport of luge. Since then Anne has battled cancer, survived a traumatic head injury, and lost her home to a hurricane - but has always emerged a winner.
