Joan Mower Broadcasting Board Of Governors

Today we welcome Joan Mower, director of development and international media training at the Broadcasting Board of Governors, which oversees Voice of America, Radio Free Europe/Radio Liberty, Radio Free Asia, and the Middle East Broadcasting Networks.

Joan will offer a fascinating look at how dramatically the world is changing because of social media, using the kidnapped schoolgirls in Nigeria as a case study in mobilizing international outrage in a short time.

Joan has worked at various times for the State Department, Freedom Forum, Newseum, UPI, and Associated Press.

A graduate of the University of California at Berkeley, Joan holds an M.A. in African studies from Johns Hopkins SAIS.
