Lisa Gring-Pemle, PhD Language of Social Change

Today we welcome Dr. Lisa M. Gring-Pemle, associate professor and associate dean of New Century College at George Mason University. She will discuss how the language of social change is a factor in how our society adapts to new ideas or resists change.

Dr. Gring-Pemle's research focuses on political communication and social policy, with an emphasis on the language of immigration.

She is the author of *Grim Fairy Tales: The Rhetorical Construction of American Welfare Policy* and a co-editor of *Readings on Political Communication*.

A Phi Beta Kappa graduate of St. Olaf College, Dr. Gring-Pemle received her M.A. and Ph.D. in communication from the University of Maryland.
