CLUB SOCIAL

Rotary's CLUB SOCIAL group makes our club strong by creating an active group anchored by strong relationships. It involves working with members and organizing activities within the club to help it function successfully. Examples are: Rotation Days, Happy Hours, Holiday Parties and Flower/Cards

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Rotary's COMMUNITY SERVICE group promotes high ethical standards in businesses and professions, recognized the worthiness of all occupations and encourages the ideal of service in the pursuit of all vocations. Examples are: Teacher Recognition, Veterans day Recognition, Safety Officer Recognition and Sherri's Books

GRANTS

Rotary's GRANTS group supports things Rotarians do to encourage and foster the advancement of understanding and goodwill among people around the world and locally. Examples are: Global International Grants, Polio Plus, Major Projects, District Local Grants/Matching Funds and Small Local Grants

Rotary's NEW GENERATIONS group recognizes the importance of students and young professionals through leadership development. Examples are: Interact, Student of the Month, Camp Enterprise, Eagan Scholarships, Boy Scouts and the Ethics Workshop

THE ROTARY FOUNDATION

Each year members are invited to contribute to The Rotary Foundation.

Paul Harris Fellow awards are presented to the member or a designee at \$1,000 increments (this can be done at \$100 or more in increments)

CLUB COMMITTEES

- **Veterans Day Recognition Committee**

Honor three veterans for their military service. Veterans from the community are invited to attend for lunch and recognition. Chair: Bri Beltran

- **Membership Committee**

Create and implement an action plan for membership development to attract, retain and engage members. Development committee procedures to achieve goals. Chair: Karen Peterson

- **The Rotary Foundation Committee**

Coordinate annual giving to the Rotary Foundation and Paul Harris Fellowship Awards. Chair: Cindy Hendrick

- **Safety Officer Recognition**

Create an annual event to recognize an Eagan Police Officer and and Eagan Firefighter. Chair: Jill Hutmacher

CLUB COMMITTEES

- **Ethics Workshop**

Work with Eagan High School to sponsor and produce our full-day annual Ethics Workshop for Juniors and Seniors. Recruit Rotarian facilitator to work with students at each table. Programs introduce students to the concepts of ethics, fairness and equality in business and life. Chair: Quinn Hutson

- **Student of the Month**

Recognize and honor an outstanding student from Eagan High School each month. Chair: Matt Sousa

- **Rambling Rotarians**

Organize interesting outings and invite club members to participate. Chair: Bob Holton

- **Annual Fundraiser**

Plan and organize our biggest annual fundraiser. Find sponsors, entertainment and food providers. Proceeds fund ALL of our committees and support grants awarded. Chair: Mike Vruno/Jeff Carter

FINANCIAL EXPECTATIONS

- ANNUAL DUES BILLED IN JULY

 - **Single Membership:** \$310

 - **Partner/Spouse Membership:** \$310 for the first member/\$235 for the second member

 - **Corporate Memberships:** Plan A \$720 for one primary member and up to three alternatives (only ONE Rotarian). Plan B \$700 for the primary member and \$115 per additional member (everyone is a Rotarian).
