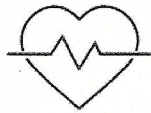

### WHO

- Every adult, child, and baby living in the United States!
- 1 Census form should be completed for all residents at each mailing address

### WHAT

- The United States constitution requires all residents to be counted every 10 years
- The questionnaire will take 12 minutes to complete. It asks nine questions about: address, race, age, and relationship to the other residents at the address, etc.

### WHEN

- Census 2020 begins in mid-March 2020
- Starting May 2020, Census workers will begin going door-to-door to addresses who have not completed the Census to ask them to respond

### HOW

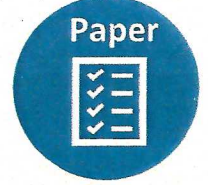
- All addresses will receive a letter in the mail with instructions about how to take the Census through the following options:

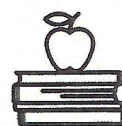

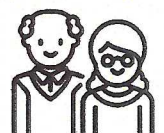

Enumerators are needed to interview and count residents of Alameda County for Census 2020. Applicants who can work evenings and weekends are preferred. Desired candidates enjoy working with people and are comfortable interacting with new people in new locations.

#### To be an eligible 2020 Census Enumerator, you must\*:

- Be at least 18 years old
- Have a valid Social Security number
- Be eligible to work in the United States
- Have a valid and active e-mail address
- Complete a job application with assessment questions answered
- Be registered with the Selective Service System or have a qualifying exemption (only for males born after Dec. 31, 1959)
- Pass a Census criminal background check, including fingerprinting
- Complete enumerator training
- Be available to work flexible hours, which can include days, evenings, and/or weekends
- Have access to transportation, a vehicle with valid driver's license or public transit

\*If you are employed elsewhere, your current job must be compatible with Census Bureau employment and not create a conflict of interest. You must not engage in any partisan political activity while on duty.
