Billie Knight (left) and Lynn Levin (right) presented a very informative program on the history of the Soroptimist International of the East Bay and the great works that it provides for women. In the presentation, Billie and Lynn answered:

Our Vision is that women and girls will have the resources and opportunities to reach their full potential and live their dreams.

Our Mission is to improve the lives of women and girls through programs leading to social and economic empowerment.

What is Soroptimist?

Soroptimist is a global women's organization whose members work to improve the lives of disadvantaged women and girls through programs leading to social and economic empowerment. Soroptimist programs focus on providing disadvantaged women and girls with access to education, which is one of the most effective ways to end social problems disproportionately affecting women and girls.

What does the word "Soroptimist" mean?

Loosely translated from Latin, Soroptimist is a coined term meaning "best for women."

When was Soroptimist formed?

The first Soroptimist club was formed in 1921 by a group of 80 women in Oakland. Our organization was founded in 1921 right here in the East Bay to provide an opportunity for professional women to participate in charitable activities specifically benefitting local women in need. The organization is represented by local clubs and has grown to an international organization with clubs formed in more than 130 countries worldwide.

What programs does Soroptimist offer?

Soroptimist members belong to local clubs. Clubs participate in the Dream Programs of Soroptimist, *Live Your Dream: Education and Training Awards for Women and Dream It, Be It: Career Support for Girls* to help disadvantaged women and girls achieve social and economic empowerment. The Dream Programs of Soroptimist ensure women and girls have access to the education and training they need to reach their full potential and live their dreams. Soroptimist is committed to investing in programs that have a sustainable, measurable change for disadvantaged women and girls.

Soroptimist also sponsors <u>LiveYourDream.org</u>, an online community empowering volunteer action and activism. The self-motivated network is made up of people who wish to support women and girls in their quest to lead better lives, while gaining inspiration in their own lives. Members of the free online community work on topics such as women's economic empowerment, ending violence against women, human trafficking, and more. They also have access to inspirational articles, tips, and blogs that can help them live their own personal dreams.

Soroptimist International of the East Bay provides the following Programs and Projects:

- *Live Your Dream: Education and Training Awards for Women* \$1000 to deserving woman going to school to improve her financial standing
- Fellowship Ph.D. Grants (specific to East Bay Region) that awarded \$100,000 last year to

10 women

- *Ruby Award:* For Women Helping Women
- Dream It, Be It: Career Support for Girls
- Violet Richardson Award \$500 to high school student doing exceptional volunteer work
- Disaster Grants for Women and Girls

They support the following community programs: Davis Street Family Resource Center, East Oakland Youth Development Center (EAYDC), Building Futures for Women and Children in San Leandro, Alameda County Deputy Sheriff's Activity League (DSAL), Hayward Community Action Network, Ruby's Place, and Calico. Fundraising activities include a Fashion Show and Luncheon for scholarships, a Holiday Boutique on December 2 at the Hill and Valley Club, a Dinner Feast for scholarships, and an annual Yard Sale (next one scheduled for March 2018.)
