Rotary Club of Castro Valley Meeting Highlights for October 24, 2017

Lunch Speaker - Rodrigo Orduña, Assistant Planning Director, Alameda County Planning Department



Rodrigo Orduña who serves as the Assistant Planning Director for the Alameda County Planning Department, Community Development Agency spoke on the implications of the Residential Design Guidelines and how they impact existing homeowners and new developers. His presentation stressed that

- The county works with builders and the community to provide guidance to integrate new, much needed housing units into existing neighborhoods.
- Both architecture, landscaping and integration into existing neighborhoods are important factors.
- Rodrigo reviewed the population growth in Castro Valley and Alameda County noting the need for control and changes to accommodate growth concerns for surrounding communities.
- Next, he reviewed the Castro Valley 2012 General Plan and the goal of preserving the "rural" feel given the Alameda County current growth. To accomplish the vision, his offices reviews regulatory changes to implement the plan along with design standards.
 - He reviewed the Top Ten Priorities for Castro Valley and focused on Design Standards goals to include building style, landscape, and streetscape goals, which were developed during workshops conducted during the planning process, community residents agreed that the following ten actions should be the top priorities over the lifetime of the General Plan. Successful execution or attainment of these clear and realistic items, which are listed in descending order of importance, will help bring Castro Valley closer to achieving its desired future.
 - 1. Highly Visible Hillside or Canyon Sites Preserved as Open Space.
 - 2. Castro Valley Streetscape Improvements.
 - 3. Enforcement of Zoning and Design Review Regulations, as well as property maintenance requirements.
 - 4. Residential Design Standards and/or Guidelines.
 - 5. Billboards Eliminated
 - 6. Neighborhood Commercial Center Sites at Heyer/Center and Lake Chabot Road/Seven Hills Renovated and/or Redeveloped.
 - 7. Commercial Façade Improvement Program.
 - 8. Revised Subdivision Standards Lot Size, Private Streets, Landscaping, etc.
 - 9. Commercial Design Review Standards and/or Guidelines.
 - 10. New neighborhood park in the western area of Castro Valley, and/or in other areas.



The county took the community's desire for improved residential development and codified it into regulations and guidelines with clear examples of what the community wants to see. While, for the single-family homeowner trying to add to their house, there may be increased costs since we require quality materials (not just T-111 plywood siding, for example), in the long run, the improved quality of the housing stock will increase property values for the community.
