Speaker of the Day: John Medlock Jr., Director of Alameda County Public Works Agency

Storm Season of 2016-2017, Preparation, Damage, and Response was the topic of Mr. Medlock's presentation with many, many photos of the damage and the work being done to repair the



many, many photos of the damage and the work being done to repair the damage, especially Redwood Road.


The 2016-2017 storm season was unusual in the sense that after many seasons of below average rain, there was higher than normal rainfall, which resulted in many storm sewer blockages, road flooding, and road failure incidents. Overall, there were 269 calls for service, 10,875 labor hours, 1,170 equipment hours, 5,600 ft³ of mud removal, and 28 county road closures of various durations. ACPWA provided round-the-clock coverage by having workers on an alternate shift schedule (i.e. one shift working and one shift of rest). ACPWA established temporary housing to accommodate its workers to implement this schedule.

The overall impact of these winter storms included:

- Short-term effects due to flooding of some roads;
- Downed trees;
- Many road closures of various durations due to slip outs;
- Road shoulder failures; and,
- Mud slides and slip outs of Calaveras Road and Mines Road.

The intermediate storm impacts included:

- Crow Canyon Road in Castro Valley localized flooding due downed trees and at least one accident involving a trapped and damaged car due to falling trees;
- Flooding of Kilkare Road in Sunol; and,
- Slope failure on Tesla Road in Livermore.





- Foothill Road in Pleasanton and Koopman Road in Livermore;
- Redwood Road in Castro Valley at 7.38 MM where the road collapsed and slipped out.
- Work has started with rough piers. Drilling and installing steel road piers is continuing and is expected to be completed by end of year
- Palomares Road at 8.73 MM in Castro Valley where work was September 22, 2017, and the road is now open.

The department provided reports and progress reports of the work through electronic media and news media as well as regular updates to the Alameda County Sheriff's Office (ACSO) and the Board of Supervisors (BOS).





The Club member were very impressed by the level of work that ACPWA handles and the timely response to the many issues in the face of severe storms, and thanked John and his staff for their work. The Club members were impressed by the response of and work ethic of the ACPWA and offered sincere appreciation and thanks for the work.
