- "480 campaigns to urge legislatures to submit suffrage amendments to voters'
- 47 campaigns to induce state constitutional conventions to write women suffrage into state constitutions,
- 277 campaigns to persuade state party conventions to include women suffrage planks;
- 30 campaigns to urge presidential party conventions to include women suffrage."


