The families are moving in and the needs are urgent: after the meeting the Board voted to donate \$4,000 to help the veterans establish their new homes. The first purchase was \$1,300 worth of box springs and mattresses.

Kamal gave a quick update on **Ron** Mazur's health. He mentioned that Ron is doing better and will join us at the Demotion evening/night. Indeed, Ron was there to receive his co-Rotarian of the Year award.



Foundation Treasurer **Ed Raney** provided an update on all the foundation's efforts for this year. This year the foundation raised \$28K through various

efforts such as lobster feed, beer sales,

etc. The foundation provided \$19 to various charities. The money invested by the foundation with the goal to reach \$1M is right now at \$287K. **Don Price**



reiterated the El Monte RV donation, and encouraged more people make a donation and receive a chance to win the raffle for a five-day use of an El Monte RV. At the subsequent drawing held on the first day of Fireworks sales, **Betty Ojo** was on hand to draw the name of **Melissa Strah**.

Congratulations to Melissa! Through Don's efforts, donations to the Club Foundation this year exceeded \$8,600, well above the \$3,500 goal.

Visit Tri-Valley



Barbara Steinfeld, President of Visit Tri-Valley spoke to the club on June 20. Visit Tri-Valley works with 37 hotels in the tri-valley region to promote tourism. The organization is funded by the hotels that are approved by the City. One half of the budget of the organization goes into marketing, one quarter into sales and the final one quarter into admin activities. Some of the things that Visit Tri-Valley has done recently are "beer trail", a lot of social media and videos. By Gautam Tandon

wine and other products from participating retailers, and the shipping will be covered by Visit Tri-Valley. Also, the organization organizes state and nation wide competitions that attract visitors and tourists from across several counties and states.

Tourism has a tremendous economic impact on tri-valley. Nearly 1.6 million tourists visit Tri-Valley every year. This generates roughly \$64 million from tax revenues and employs 5,900 people.

The major country from where visitors come to visit Tri-Valley is China. It's so important that Tri-Valley specifically advertises about the region in China, and spends around \$2 million to attract the Chinese market. The next biggest market is UK and there are plans to market in UK also.





Another interesting campaign that the organization has come up with is called "You Sip We Ship". In this campaign, visitors can buy
