

KEYNOTE SPEAKER: PROF. TONY LIMA, PHD

KEYNOTE SPEAKER: FRAN DAVID

Bob Sakai introduced our keynote speaker, Fran David. Fran David is the recently retired City Manager of Hayward. Ms. David delivered a fascinating talk about the current housing crisis in the Bay Area.

Demand for housing is at an all-time high. She noted that \$560,000 is the median home prize in Bay Area, and \$546,000 in Hayward. There has been 35% increase in the number of \$1 million homes in San Francisco, a 28% increase in Oakland, and a 14% increase in San José. 150% above price in CA for housing compared to the whole USA.

More and more Millennials are living with parents, but they want to be homeowners. Homelessness is a problem throughout our USA.

Climate Change is another big problem. If there is a 9' rise in sea level by 2050, as most scientists think, then vast areas of the Hayward lowlands, including the industrial area, could be inundated.

President Sean presented Ms. David a book, "Berenstain Bears Help the Homeless," that will be donated to the Hayward Library in honor of her keynote talk.

- 3. Leadership role in a club activity (Rodeo, Omelet Brunch, Child Spree, etc.)-
- 4. Contribution to Hayward Rotary Foundation
- 5. Bring new member(s) into the club

Vocational Service - Shares job skills with others. Maintains high ethical standards.

- 1. Leadership role in the Chamber of Commerce
- 2. Conducts training sessions for people within his/her field
- 3. Member of a professional/vocational group that has activities/projects to help improve the performance of people in that profession.
- 4. Member of an international organization that provides programs for improving job skills of its members.*

Community Service - Works in projects/activities that improves the quality of community life.

- 1. Rodeo, Child Spree, Omelet Brunch, etc. and/or fundraising support of Rotary projects
- 2. Serve as an Elected Official
- 3. Serve on an appointed local government commission, board or committee
- 4. Be a member of a group that works to improve the quality of life in the community

International Service - Helps expands Rotary's humanitarian reach and/or promotes world understanding and peace.

- 1. Recipient of a Paul Harris Fellowship or contributes regularly to The Rotary Foundation
- 2. Host a person from a foreign country
- 3. Attend Rotary International Conference
- 4. Go to a foreign country to help with a community improvement project
