

Keynote Presentation

Past President Pam Russo introduced our keynote speaker, Paul McCreary the new General Manager of the Hayward Area Recreation and Park District (HARD). Mr. McCreary assumed leadership of HARD almost six months ago. He was formerly the Parks and Community Services Director for the City of Dublin. Pam introduced him as "innovative, inclusive and a strong business person".

Mr. McCreary gave and overview of HARD, a place to explore, play and learn. HARD is an independent special use district created by local voters over 70 years ago to provide park and recreation services to over 280,000 residents of Hayward, Castro Valley, San Lorenzo, Ashland, Cherryland and Fairview in a 100 square mile area.

Mr. McCreary shared his initial very positive impressions of Hayward and the warm welcome he has received. He highlighted the Treasures of HARD including the Japanese Gardens, the Hayward Shoreline Interpretive Center, Kennedy Park, the Meek Estate and Park, the Mt. Eden Mansion, the Douglass Morrison Theatre, the Alden E. Oliver Sports Park, the Sulphur Creek Nature Center, the Hayward Plunge and the Rowell Ranch Rodeo Park.

Mr. McCreary outlined the programs offered by HARD and the master plan. With the goals to maintain and improve parks and the desire to expand recreational opportunities for all, there is consideration being given to bond feasibility potentially for a 2016 elections. He asked for input from all at www.HaywardRec.org/survey

Property tax is the only source of income for HARD and deferred maintenance is an issue. Mr. McCreary and the HARD Board of Directors are actively looking to secure additional state, federal and local bond funding as well as fundraising to ensure the growth and ongoing service of HARD to our communities.


