## KEYNOTE SPEAKER: WENDY WINSTED "WOOLLY 'N WILD AT SULPHUR CREEK NATURE CENTER"

**Pam Russo**, past president of Rotary and current executive director of Hayward Area Recreation and Park District Foundation, was called to the podium to introduce the guest speaker of the day, but she first asked that the club give **President Sean** a round of applause for his presidency and for bringing cheer and fun to the club every week. **Pam** then introduced Wendy Winsted, Program Director and Recreation Coordinator at Sulphur Creek Nature Center in Hayward. Ms. Winsted started at Sulphur Creek as animal caretaker and now is the director of wildlife education.

Ms. Winsted presented a most interesting window into the everyday happenings at the Sulphur Creek nature center. She named the different animals and birds the center has in its care, and listed the quantities of groceries, dog food, and small fry (mice, rats and chicks) required to feed the army of bats, owls, raccoons and other varied animals daily. She emphasized the volunteer hours necessary to maintain upkeep and the special meal requirements of the some of the creatures the center looks after. She even brought along with her a Turkey Vulture and a Townsend Big Eared Bat.

The Turkey Vulture has a broken wing and therefore cannot fly again. But because of this he makes a good aid in educating people who visit the nature center. He is befittingly named Prince Charming.

The center found out that they are one of the only places that have successfully reared a Townsend Big eared bat, as the bat does not survive or do well in captivity. Ms. Winsted attributed Sulphur Creek's success to the dedicated and excellent care staff and the fact that the bat came to the center when it was very young and therefore could acclimate itself to its life there without knowing what it was missing.

At the conclusion of Ms. Winsted's keynote address, **President Sean** presented her with a children's book, *Creek Finding - A True Story*, that will be donated to the Hayward children's library in honor of her keynote speech.
