Introducing the presenter was Sgt at Arms **Janiene Langford**, program manager for STEM Education at Cal State East Bay.



The presenter was Erik Helgren, associate professor and chair, of the Department of Physics at California State University, East Bay, who spoke about the university's Solar Suitcase Project.

Working with Prof. Karina Garbesi, Cal State East Bay has developed the Solar Suitcase Project based around creation of stand-alone solar systems that are donated to energy poor systems around the world.

The program has multiple collaborators including the We Care Solar organization, schools in Hayward Unified School District's Hayward Promise

Neighborhood , and funders including PG&E and the Hayward Rotary Club.

We Care Solar – www.WeCareSolar.org - was founded by Laura Stachel and husband Hal Aronson in 2009. The nonprofit program targets facilities in regions of Africa without reliable electricity. The "solar suitcases" provide highly efficient solar energy systems to power medical lighting, mobile communications and essential medical devices.

Prof. Helgren described the suitcases as creating "a miniature off-grid system that can run the lights in a medical facility all night long." It was originally developed to address power outages in medical facilities in African countries such as Tanzania and Nigeria. The role has now been expanded to serve students and educational institutions that need light at night for studies.

CSUEB students learn the technology and build the suitcases and perform outreach at HUSD schools such as Winton and Cesar Chavez. The Cal State students are in charge of building, testing, troubleshooting, and installing the solar systems.

The suitcases built at Cal State East Bay and in the schools are then sent overseas and installed by nonprofit partners. They provide power and light for children in energy-deficient schools, orphanages and refugee





centers in Uganda and Kenya.

More than 2,000 suitcases have been delivered to health centers and educational facilities in Africa since the program's inception. A fully deployed suitcase – including parts, labor and delivery to Africa – costs about \$2,000.

Last year 50 CSUEB students and 150 middle and high school students



from Hayward participated in the program, benefiting thousands of students in Africa. More than 250 HUSD students have experienced the program over the past three years and it has expanded to include participants at five additional California State University campuses.
