

#### Keynote Speaker

Fire Chief **Garrett Contreras** introduced our keynote speaker, Alameda County Sheriff Greg Ahern. Sheriff Ahern began his talk by expressing appreciation for the opportunity to follow up on his visit to the Hayward Rotary Club in 2015. Sheriff Ahern has been the county's sheriff/coroner since he was elected in 2006. A graduate of Moreau Catholic High School and St. Mary's College, he has worn the sheriff's department badge since 1980.

Sheriff Ahern said he was concerned by publicity about the use of force by law enforcement nationwide, and asked Rotarians to consider that there are 18,000 law enforcement entities and 800,000 officers, and that incidents on use of force are statistically rare. He noted that budget cuts have cut community policing and special enforcement units that address gangs or drugs, and the result is a focus on enforcement actions.

"We'd like for officers to spend more time on building community relationships," he said.

A result of increased attention to use of force is the development of body worn cameras, which are activated anytime an officer hits the red lights on their patrol car, pulls a weapon or taser, or when in the proximity of another officer's camera. The flip side, he said, is that they can record children or citizens unrelated to law-breaking behavior and saving all this data on a computer server is costly.

Sheriff Ahern said that law enforcement's increasing use of body armor and "ballistic vehicles" is largely driven by the increasing firepower of criminals who have access to assault rifles and thousands of rounds of ammunition. He said high tech weaponry such as guns with crimson traced laser sights and communications improvements in radios and computers help keep officers protected against criminals.

Drones, known officially as "unmanned aerial systems," have become more helpful, used recently to spot hot zones for large building fires in Emeryville and Berkeley, as well as to assist officers in hot pursuit of suspects, such as a recent chase in Fremont when two officers had been shot and the suspect was ditching four guns while being pursued.

Ultimately, Sheriff Ahern said, officers are responding to thousands of emergency calls a day and rarely get the recognition they deserve.

"When you have the opportunity," he told Rotarians, "thank our officers for doing a difficult job."

#### Adjournment

#### Keynote Speaker

**Larry Ratto** introduced our keynote speaker **Linda Granger. Linda** is the Superintendent of the Eden Area Regional Occupational Program (ROP) in Hayward. Her keynote address was "Trends in Vocational Education."

Eden Area ROP provides career technical education programs in partnership with four school districts: Castro Valley Unified School District, Hayward Unified School District, San Leandro Unified School District and San Lorenzo Unified School District. There are two type of classes offered: on the high school campuses and at the ROP center in Hayward.

Courses are offered in Arts, Media & Entertainment; Building and Construction Trades, Education; Child Development and Family Services; Information and Communication Technologies; Manufacturing and Product Development; Marketing

Sales and Service; Public Services; Transportation; Health Science and Medical Technology; Business and Finance; Hospital; Tourism and Recreation.

Key program highlights include the First Responders program offered in partnership with the Hayward Fire Department (HFD). This program provides students with an understanding of what is required to be a firefighter/EMT. Students develop skills at the HFD training facility working side-by-side with working firefighters.

The Eden ROP program prepares students for careers and further education as well as to instill workplace values that will enable them to compete successfully in the economy of today and the future.

In the Q&A session, **Garrett Contreras** stated that the contributions and positive impact **Linda Granger** has made on the students is a testament to her commitment to education. The community is lucky to have her.
