Now in its 15th year, the Literacy Project has invested over \$300,000 and reached over 30,000 Hayward students.



KEYNOTE SPEAKER

President Stephens introduced Milly Seibel, Assistant Governor for Area 4 and a past president of Rotary Club of Livermore, who introduced keynote speaker Orrin Mahoney, Rotary District 5170 Governor. Assistant Governor Seibel noted that Area 4, which Hayward Rotary joined this year, is part of District 5170. District Governor Mahoney lives in Cupertino. He is a graduate of Carnegie-Mellon University and earned a Master's degree from Stanford University. Since retiring from a 35-year management career with Hewlett-Packard, he has devoted considerable time to community service, including serving as a former member of the Cupertino City Council, during which time he served two terms as Mayor. He is an active member and past president of the Rotary club of Cupertino.

District Governor Mahoney noted that his theme as District Governor this year is "Rotary: Building Lifelong Friendships while Making a Difference." He said his involvement with Rotary started with "six magic words: 'Have you ever thought about Rotary?' " He offered the good news that District 5170 had the highest membership gain of all clubs in the Western Region last year, but added the bad news is that the increase was only 55 new members on a base of 4,000. He added that Rotary membership in general is down and that only two other regions had any growth at all. Rotary is responding to this challenge, he said, by changing some rules regarding meetings and membership qualifications. He said the organization is allowing more flexibility in attendance policies and adding new types of meetings such as eClubs that meet online and Passport Clubs that meet only once a month but work on projects with other clubs. He said that membership qualifications have moved from limiting membership to business and professional leaders to opening membership up to anyone who has experience and a desire to do good work in their community.

He spoke about one of the four Rotary Objects, "Development of acquaintances as an opportunity for service," noting that being in Rotary not only offers the opportunity to make lifelong friendships, but also offers opportunities to do things to help others that individuals do not often have, such as international trips to provide services or equipment that are not readily available in remote places. He quoted Bill Gates, founder of Microsoft, who spoke at a Rotary International meeting and suggested that only an international organization like Rotary has the scope and scale to do big international projects.

Governor Mahoney described District 5170 as encompassing an area roughly bounded by Piedmont and Montclair to the north, Hollister to the south, Palo Alto to the east and the San Jose area to the west. He said the District strives to inspire and support its member Clubs through the use of tools, training programs and motivating events. He spoke about the importance of youth services such as the Interact clubs and Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA), a life-changing camp experience teaching leadership skills to young people. He also noted that a considerable amount of donations from local clubs to the Rotary Foundation come back to the local clubs through district-designated funds.

Governor Mahoney then recognized and presented awards to two new club Paul Harris Fellows: **President-elect Sid Hamadeh** and **María Ochoa**. He also recognized the following "Double Sustainers" who have made or pledged at least \$100 or more: **Past President Sean Reinhart, Secretary Mona Diamantine, Valerie Caveglia, Douglas Den Hartog, Dave Elkins,**


ADJOURNMENT
