Fines and Foolishness


Red Badge members April Chan and Connie Willis served as fine collectors.

Keynote Presentation

Sid Hamadeh introduced our keynote speaker: Geoff Harries, owner and CEO of Buffalo Bill's Brewery and new venture, Russell City Distillery.

Mr. Harries opened his talk with a story of how as a boy he used to steal prune juice, mix it with yeast, put a lid on it, then stash it in the bushes for a few weeks to ferment it. Geoff would then share the resulting concoction, which had up to 5% alcohol content, with his neighborhood friends.

He told of when he was in high school, how he bought a book by legendary craft brewer Bill Owens about the brewer's art. From his early start as a brewer, Mr. Harries experimented with the rich flavors of fruit esters—blueberry, strawberry, and the now-classic pumpkin—which he successfully imparts to his brews to this day.

After college, Mr. Harries went to work for Bill Owens as a brewer at Buffalo Bill's Brewery, one of America's first and best-known brewpubs. When Mr. Owens decided to sell the business in 1991, Mr. Harris, by then a Master Brewer in his own right, jumped at the chance to buy it. Because banks were hesitant to offer a traditional loan, he took out cash advances on all his credit cards – nearly \$80,000! – and used the funds to buy "the most important brewpub in America."

Under his leadership, Buffalo Bill's has grown to become a landmark in Hayward and for brewpub enthusiasts across the nation. Over the years the brewpub has significantly expanded with more dining room space, new product lines, and now employs 96 employees. The company brews and bottles a full line of craft beers for national distribution. The brewing operation is currently handled at a facility in Ukiah, but Mr. Harries is making arrangements to move his bottling operations to a facility in Hayward.

Mr. Harries is expanding his business with the construction of Russell City Distillery a few steps away from his brewery. The new distillery spans 3,700 square feet plus a 400-square-foot tasting room and retail space. Russell City Distillery will produce Hayward-crafted vodka, gin, rum and agave spirits, and will feature a tasting room, facility tours, and sales of bottled spirits on site. When completed in 2017, the renovated facility will house a 750-liter, 17.5-foot-tall Arnold Holstein still and three 500-gallon fermenters. The equipment will allow the spirit producer to manufacture up to 5,000 cases a year at peak capacity.

Russell City's primary business will come from restaurant sales and wholesale distribution, however a significant part of the business will also include distillery tours, sample tastings of the artisanal offerings, and retail sales of bottled spirits on site.

In building Russell City Distillery, Mr. Harries told the San Francisco Chronicle that he is seeking to create something "unique and indigenous to the area" that reflects local history and "turns it into something that people enjoy drinking."



Introductions


Our Visiting Rotarian was introduced by **Dave Elkins:** Bob Tucknott, Electrical Contractor with the Dublin Club.

Red Badge Rotarian **Dan Goldstein** delivered his vocational talk. **Dan** shared that he was born in Boston and his Dad was an attorney at the time and then decided to get a science degree in decapitation so his family moved to Tucson for couple of years and then moved to San Rafael, California when he was three years old.

When he attended high school there was little bit of a challenge where he was losing interest. So Dan was on a mission to find the best schools in different counties. He wanted to be in the hardest learning school in the area where he wanted to be challenged until he found one of the top private schools in the country that he really liked. From high school, he went on to UC Berkeley.

His father died when he was a freshman at UC Berkeley. So he ended up working for the campus police department to work his way through school.

Dan had the reputation of finding all the nude people in campus. He did appreciate the value and quality of education that he received from public, private high school and one of top university. That allowed him the opportunity to a great career path of becoming a cyber security engineer for one top cyber company in the world. Keynote Presentation

Stan Dobbs introduced our keynote speaker, Lindsey Vien.

Lindsey Vien is Education Services Manager for City of Hayward. Ms. Vien presented the groundbreaking Hayward After School Homework Support Centers.

The After School Homework Support Centers were established in 2009 by Hayward Public Library, and soon expanded to local schools in partnership with Hayward Unified School District.

Today the Centers have expanded to thirteen Hayward school sites that serve over 3,500 students per day, four days per week during the school year.

Ms. Vien launched this program seven years ago and continues to manage it today. She earned her Bachelor's and Master's degrees in English, both from California State University, Hayward (yes, when it was "HAYWARD"), and has over 15 years of experience working with youth and education in the Hayward community.

Their goal is to provide students with a safe and welcoming learning environment and to assist students in K-12 grades with all of their academic needs in reading, writing, basic and complex math skills, science, Social Studies, Foreign language, Projects and computers.

Homework Support Center also provides students and parents, access to netbooks and Chromebooks. They have access to the internet, (XL typing and reading programs used within each HSC). Parents have access to check-out Chromebook for home usage and school sites, Bilingual Chromebook training classes, and Comcast internet essential programs.

Ms. Vien then introduced to the podium Alexia Lamarque, tutor from HSC. Tutors comes from various places such as Chabot College MESA students, CSUEB Service Learning Students, Federal Work Study students and volunteers from our community. All tutors want to work with students and have some sort of expertise in a certain subject area.

Statistics have shown that after attending 20 tutoring sessions, 72% of students improved on their post mathematics assessments by 5% or more; 69% of students improved on their post ELA assessments by 5% or more.

110 volunteer tutors donated 8,476 hours to our Centers. 3,111 new "Made in Hayward" library cards were issued to students who had no previous card.

This is how this inspired and inventive project helps Hayward students achieve measurable academic results, one student at a time.

At the conclusion of the presentation, **President Sean Reinhart** presented a children's book, *Berenstain Bears' No Homework Hassle*, that will be dedicated in Ms. Vien's name and placed in the Hayward Library collection.
