MARY FRANCES, Superintendent of the Palo Alto Unified School District, described a life rich with vivid experiences in the education field in places as diverse as East Los Angeles and Korea. She was one of the first group of women to matriculate at Santa Clara University. She loves the arts and travel and is a Giants fan. She thanked us for her warm welcome to the community, and left us with a nice

thought: "*If you can't laugh every day, you're not going to have a very good life.*"

GLORIA was born in the United States but spent almost all of her first 17 years in Asia with her diplomat father. After college she gravitated into education which she found she loved and where she has taught for years in area community colleges and has served on the California State University Board of Trustees. She told us of her adventures in elective politics and described her large and growing family. She thanked the club for the welcome it extended to her as one of its first woman members.



STEVE, Palo Alto's new Director of Planning, told us about a career in urban planning that took shape as early as his high school years and led him on a well-devised path from one municipality to another until he happily landed a job where he lived, in Palo Alto. *STEVE's show-stopper: "My wife and I talked about living in a foreign country. We moved to Los Angeles."*
