Dr. Karen Smith is an infectious disease specialist who works in conjunction with Stanford Medical Center and County Health Agencies. Bioterrorism is intended to do more damage by creating public panic and social disruption than actual harm to individuals. 17 nations are known to have the capability to deliver viruses,

bacteria and toxins. Iraq and Russia were the largest know depositories of these weapons. Terrorism is both a domestic as well as international threat. There are three phases to the development of an anti-bioterrorism program including: Phase I – Early recognition, reporting and confirmation; Phase II – Response; and Phase III – Recovery. The public health system is under severe pressure to bring the resources together to combat bioterrorism as well as natural disasters such as earth-quakes
