#### SPECIAL PRESENTATION

Lotay Rinchen gave a 10-minute slide presentation on Bhutan, an ancient kingdom in the Himalayas between the northeastern portion of India and China, and as of a year ago, by efforts of the new king (educated at Harvard and Oxford), the world's newest democracy. The Royal Family has established Gross National Happiness, a mixture of material and spiritual improvement. Bhutan is a beautiful, spiritual place to visit and the wild marijuana is all fed to pigs, none to people. MIKE COUCH encouraged us to go.

#### **PROGRAM**

Dionne Bunsha, a Stanford Knight Fellow, spoke to us on "Who's Riding the Tiger? Exploring the Underbelly of the Shining India Hype". It was a fascinating and insightful talk on the problems India faces, with its dichotomy of having more billionaires than any other country, but with half the population of cities like Mumbai (Bombay) living in slums or on the streets, and long-standing national policies that have driven many farmers into overwhelming debt, poverty, and suicide. Contaminated water leads to hundreds of thousands of deaths each year from diarrhea – a preventable disease. Corruption is a key issue, but there are visionaries living the lessons of Gandhi, who are the likely movers to turn matters around.

The talk led to a question and answer period, with input from BETSY BECHTEL on the problems of infrastructure and clean drinking water, RALPH ADAMS on India's contradictions of gender and religious prejudice, VICKY CHING on class structure, ROB LANCEFIELD on farming and failing banks, BILL LOVE on bribery interfering with the work of charities, DICK FREEMAN on the conflict in Kashmir (Bunsha placed that on Nehru's failing to keep his word on a plebiscite), SY GREENSTONE on his observations on a trip some years ago, JUDITH STEINER on the value of donating computers to villages, and DIANA DIAMOND on whether the government is corrupt, lazy, or indifferent (yes to all).
