Today's speaker, Greg Rosston, was introduced by TONY CARRASCO. Greg spoke on the Economic Policy of the Obama Administration. (Ed.: I looked up Greg on Google and was overwhelmed. Just a few items: National Credit Union Leader, Stanford Professor, Chief Economist with the FCC, etc.)

Greg related his various experiences in Washington, working on economic issues and other matters. He mentioned that a tax would be simpler, but might not accomplish the objective of reducing CO2 emissions. When asked why the Stimulus Bill doesn't seem to have much of an effect, he informed us that little of the allocated money had yet been spent. The FCC'S transition to digital TV appears to be on schedule, although it affects only about 20% of the population. A very interesting series of topics was covered by Greg Rosston, giving us a graphic view of Washington Politics.
