A GREAT PROGRAM on CALIFORNIA HISTORY

Following an introduction by GINNY LEAR, we were treated to a most interesting presentation by ARCHAEOLOGIST...Mark Hylkema.

Although Mark's talk was billed as "Early Palo Alto...Ohlone Indians" he shared 18,000 years of Indian history noting that the first Europeans didn't arrive until 240 years ago. The Spanish, looking for a safe harbor, discovered San Francisco Bay and met the local residents, the Ohlone People. The Indian population in our area was only exceeded, numbers wise, by the Aztecs in Mexico. They had developed a life style well suited to the area dining on acorns and insects. What they were not well suited to was the white man's diseases which utterly decimated our native ancestors. A very interesting presentation by an excellent presenter.
