Today's speaker, the renowned Professor Donald Kennedy, was introduced by GEORGE FITZGERALD. Prof. Kennedy, who was recently the president of Stanford University, spoke on climate change, which judging from his remarks, he considers to be one of the top, if not the top problem facing our planet. He cited an ancient Greek philosopher-

Prof. Kennedy spoke of two possible solutions, providing we have the will to change, by adapting to climate change, or mitigation in which we try to mitigate climate change with government action around the world. He mentioned the developing nations, the so-called BRIC countries, Brazil, Russia, India and China as being particularly significant, since they have large and expanding economies. However, he did not lose sight of the fact that our own country is the largest contributor to the current crisis. A key milestone is the upcoming international conference this fall in Copenhagen, which hopes to improve on the Kyoto protocols.
