PROGRAM

Today's speaker was Craig Harding, Corporate Counsel of Tesla Motors. Tesla has grown as an electric car maker to 500 employees. The company sells directly to customers and its sports car model sells for \$109,000 and costs \$4.50 to charge the batteries for a 244 mile range. Currently located in San Carlos, the company is expanding to a 370,000 square foot facility in the Stanford Research Park. 800 cars have been sold thus far. The next model will be a four door sedan to be delivered in 2012. The anticipated cost will be \$57,000 and is projected to equal the cost of a Ford Taurus after consideration for tax breaks and the cost of operation.
