STEVE PLAYER introduced Bob Bowlsby, Athletic Director at Stanford. Bob spent most of his life and career in Iowa; his family has 22 degrees from the University of Iowa! BOB has completed his fifth season at Stanford, with his first being a 1-11 season, when he wondered, "Where is the varsity?"

Having just won the Orange Bowl with star players and coaching, Stanford is now on top, and is receiving well-deserved accolades and media attention. Bob suggested, "I'm now very

popular with people I don't want to talk to."



Stanford is different in many ways from Ivy League schools: Stanford Athletics graduates 19 of 20 students with majors' distribution being the same as with undergraduates. Stanford just had 3 students receive the NCAA's "Top Student and Athlete" award. Only 8 awards were given nationally.

OUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Q: How do you recruit? These have been such unusual years. A: The biggest challenge is to "get in" with kids early. Campus tours often "seal the deal", especially with help from VIPS such as Condoleezza Rice.

Q: Should Stanford hire an "outside" coach?

A: Inside guys are a lot cheaper and know what's going on. Students almost always favor inside candidates.

Q: What about PAC 10 vs. PAC 12?

A: Bob was on the expansion committee and favors PAC12 because of better playoff and revenue opportunities.

Q: How do you compare Jim Harbaugh and Bill Walsh?

A: Both share the ability to innovate. Jim and Bill spent good time together before Bill's death. Winning has been a #1 priority for both.

Q: What about wealth distribution in the conference and are poorer schools dropping football?

A: There's a good distribution of bowl opportunities and TV revenues to most schools.

Q: What about obesity and health involvement?

A: Stanford Athletics is involved with Stanford's BWELL program. Student body has lowest incidence of smoking of any campus.

Q: What attributes are you seeking in a coach?

A: A good coach has to fit with academics and athletics. The right candidate will: 1. Convey a message. 2. Create a strategy. 3. Have integrity. 4. Believe in college athletics.

BOB'S birthday is today and he received this very appropriate Chinese fortune: "You will continue to take chances, and will be glad you did". MIKE thanked Bob, and announced a dictionary will be presented in his honor to a second grade student in East Palo Alto.
