
VISITING ROTARIANS AND GUESTS

OUR PROGRAM: CASH ALAEE AND IRAN

GEORGE FITZGERALD introduced our speaker, CASH ALAEE, who was born in Iran, but grew up in the US. He has extended family in Iran who he went to visit. We here in the US often think of Iran as a desert country, but it actually is a mountainous landscape with fertile valleys. It is a complex



society with 20 languages and 12 religious groups with the majority Shiite.

ALAEE's perspective is that ordinary people of Iran are living about the same life as we are in the US. They want to have jobs, raise and educate their family, and do interesting things. They are really not that concerned about the government at the national level.

Iran considers itself as superior to the other countries in the region and wants to be considered as a regional power. It's all about money and how to make money. It is rooted in their way of life.

CASH showed us some great pictures of Iran and his family in Iran. It was great for ALAEE to make contact with his relatives, and plans to go there again sometime in the future.
