DISTRICT GOVERNOR





PROGRAM

GEORGE FITZGERALD introduced Dr. Elias Aboujaoude,, Stanford Hospital Psychiatrist, who graduated from UCSF and Stanford Medical School.

Dr. Aboujaoude is a psychiatrist and author based at Stanford, where he is Director of the Impulse Control Disorders Clinic and the <u>Obsessive Compulsive Disorder Clinic</u>. His research interests have focused on obsessive compulsive disorder and behavioral addictions, including problematic Internet use.

Dr. Aboujaoude described Internet addiction, and how our dayto-day reality and sense of ourselves are changing as a function of our online activity. The author of the book, *Virtually You: The Dangerous Powers of the E-Personality*, Dr. Aboujaoude used sobering examples from his research and clinical and personal experience to illustrate Internet addiction problems.

Traits of Internet addiction include: Impulsivity, attention deficit disorder, E-language usage in real life, online negativity and violence, and personal, ethical, and moral changes.

Q What should we do, given this trend?

A We need more education about psychological implications, plus assessment of virtual behavior.

Q What about online courses and testing?

A Classes without personal interaction are problematic.

Q What about social accountability? And please come back to present again when we have more time.

A We're not as good as we think we are in compartmentalizing, so online behavior spills over to real life. And yes, I'll be glad to present another time, if you wish.

Appropriately, a dictionary will be presented to a second grader at Green Oaks Academy in DR Dr. Aboujaoude's honor.
