OPENING REMARKS

Amy Antonelli talked about an inspiring Atlanta housewife



who turned a great personal disaster into a means of helping the unfortunate. When a daughter, one of ten children, developed a bipolar disorder and ended her life, the mother discovered that for some years the daughter had been supporting an orphanage at a leper colony in India. She then visited the orphanage and learned of the

hopelessly sorry plight of lepers in India, outcasts regarded as responsible for their own fate, and without opportunities to live normal productive lives. Determined to do something about that, upon returning home she started a charity, Rising Star Outreach, and raised a quarter million dollars the first year. Amy learned of Rising Star as an Apple employee on a humanitarian mission to India, following a recent tsunami. She left Apple and became Rising Star's Executive Director in India. In her talk and a two-minute video, she reviewed Rising Star's good works -- mobile medical units, schools, and micro-finance program. As those efforts brightened the lives of the colony, Amy hopes that similar ones will soon transform the condition of lepers throughout India.

THE PROGRAM: A PERSPECTIVE ON ENERGY POLICY IN CALIFORNIA

LYNDA STEELE introduced former California Energy Commissioner Jeffrey Byron as one who describes himself as an "energy policy wonk," who promptly proceeded to wonk the audience through the roles and accomplishments



of the Commission and what should be done policywise in California, the U.S., and the world. He was not optimistic about the latter two, but said California has done a lot of innovative, technology-forcing things right. He was all in favor of increased insistence on renewable forms of energy. He informed the gathering of the California Desert Conservation Area.

comprising about a third of the state, within which 150 square miles will be devoted to renewable solar based energy generation. He noted enviros' support for renewable as a concept, but found they always opposed and often substantially delayed or blocked specifics. He did not think those obstructions would diminish through changes in the legal system. On an upbeat note and beyond the reach of the enviros, he showed that the most effective and most profitable thing individuals could do to reduce global warming would be to replace incandescent bulbs with compact fluorescent ones.

BREAKING NEWS: DEBUNKING BEGINS

Former PRESIDENT RALPH encouraged attendance at next week's debunking of PRESIDENT MIKE, who he said graduated in the top ten percent of his Academy Class, noting that he had graduated in the top 90% of his West Point class, the equivalent of Navy's top ten percent, getting in an opening barb for the debunking.
