Membership Chair GINNY LEAR reviewed the membership numbers for the past year and noted that we remained approximately the same as we have for many years. The Committee meets the first Thursday of every other month, making the next meeting on September 1st. At GEORGE's suggestion we all gave the Committee Members a rousing round of applause. A fantastic job last year, gang!

PRESIDENT SHERRI'S REPORT ON THE "STATE OF THE PALO ALTO ROTARY CLUB"

My Vision is that we build on the successes of the past year and add to them, for example:

Last year we raised a net of \$40,000 for charitable grants for this year. This year, I want to raise \$45,000 for President-elect HAL's charitable grants budget next year.

We ended last year with no net gain in membership. This year I want us to end the year with more than 150 members. And I hope



that at least one or more either plays the piano or plays the guitar, so we can add music to more of our meetings.

And I hope that we can raise the profile of the Palo Alto Rotary Club by increasing our participation in Hands-On events, like the tree planting we did this past year and by doing *more joint projects with other clubs – Rotary*

as well as our local Kiwanis.

But, in order to implement my vision, which I hope is the vision of all of us; we each need to do the following:

Get involved:

Committees – we have lots of choices and a list is at the table – Ihope everyone signs up for at least one committee.

Events – social, as well as fundraising. I know we have two social events coming up – the first is at IRIS's on July 27 and the second is a joint picnic with the University Club on August 20 and, if anyone is interested, on August 13 it is Rotary Day at the A's. (I know our club would prefer the Giants – but the game was already selected by the District honchos).

Hands-On projects – like the tree planting we did with Canopy – these are still to be determined.

Fundraising – the more money we raise, the more we can give for

our scholarships, our community grants, and our future vision/world service grants.

Speaking of fundraising – there are three times you will be asked to donate this year:

The Rotary Foundation – these funds come back to us in the form of matching grants and community grants for many of our international projects.

Our own Palo Alto Endowment Fund – 5% comes back to us every year to use for local charitable giving including scholarships, and

Our annual fundraiser – the money raised from this event funds the following year's local grants – a chance to make a big difference in our local community.

In the next week or so, you will be receiving the invoice for this year's dues – you will notice that it has been increased by \$15, and is now \$300 annually. This increase covers the dues increase for our district.

And one other area of fundraising, for those of you new to our *club* – *we don't do a lot of fining that other service clubs do* – *we* will do some occasionally, but sometimes you just want to brag about something, like I did earlier – so you make a donation to the *President's Club – the suggested amount is \$100. These funds are* included in our charities budget – this year we hope to raise at least \$10,000- through the President's Club.

The bottom line for me this year is to have fun, make new friends and raise some funds for worthy causes.
