

Today's speakers' coordinator, WALT HAYS, was introduced by PREZ SHERRI, who in turn introduced Jeff Parker, TOM GRACON, and BOB McCOWAN, who in turn, described various aspects of the World Community Service program of our Club.



Jeff (Picture not available) described the vision projects now being pursued in China, primarily the practice of cataract surgery. TOM (Picture not available) spoke of service to those suffering from hearing loss. There is a school for the deaf, the only one in an area populated by about twenty-million in the vicinity of San Paulo, Brazil. The school

trains the deaf with skills that help them obtain jobs. There is also a treatment program for those who have a cleft palate, serving that same area of Brazil.

BOB described his travel through the countryside in the Yucatan, exploring volunteer service opportunities to be pursued later. In the meantime, he assisted in the delivery of wheelchairs. World Community Service is an activity all Rotarians can be proud of. It serves the most-in-need segments of our world population. WALT will try to make information more available regarding the program by scheduling more frequent committee meetings. At present, there are projects concerning the following in poor, remote areas: Composting Toilets (Haiti), Fuel-Efficient Stoves (Guatemala). Farmers Market (Yucatan), and Literacy (Panama).
