He then reviewed the very impressive academic credentials and extensive media experience of today's Speaker, Adriana De La Fuentes, a past Governor of District 4170 in Mexico,





comprised of 88 clubs. She spoke at length and with great warmth and enthusiasm about many good deeds that financial assistance from The Rotary Foundation had helped her district achieve in health and educational areas. Among those accomplishments she highlighted construction of a school for young children, surgery to remedy cleft palates, and a program that had provided life with dignity to 1,300
