ART STAUFFER introduced our speaker, John Perry,



Stanford emeritus Professor of Philosophy, and former member of the PA University Rotary Club, resigning when he didn't have to get up that early anymore. His Cv is long and distinguished. He has a radio program on KALW 91.7, every Sunday called "Philosophy Talk." www.philosophytalk.org. He won an

Ig Nobel Prize for his writings on "Structured Procrastination," which led into his talk today on "Selfdeception or How We Get in Our Own Way." Procrastination, he explained, is when the most important thing to be done is ignored by doing a lot of unimportant things. Or, to not do something in a way that is productive, we need self-deceptive skills. It turns out that most often deadlines come and go; and it doesn't matter. Perfectionism in procrastination is when one has a fantasy about how perfect we mean to do it, when an adequate job is usually acceptable. Self-deception is when we recruit beliefs to support competing cognitions. Self-deception is not always bad. It makes us feel better about ourselves. Alarm clocks play a role in some accomplishments. Dr. Perry has them all over his house. Set one for any amount of time and quit what you are doing when it rings. You will have accomplished something. He said he unplugs his laptop when he sits down to use it, because he knows the battery will expire. It was an entertaining and interesting talk about real things we all face, unless we were deceived.
