The affable LIZ KNISS introduced James Reifschneider, a Detective Sergeant



with the Investigative Services Division of the Palo Alto Police Department. James graduated summa cum laude from Santa Clara Law School and gravitated to police work. He has been with the PA force for seven years, during which he trained in many police specialties. Of note is the fact he was awarded the "Local Hero" Award from the Chamber of Commerce.

Just how big a problem are we dealing with, you ask? Well, in 2010 there were 8.6 million victims of fraud or identity theft at a whopping

loss of 13.3 billion dollars. That's "billion," folks.

A few of the descriptive words for this line of work are: mail theft, burglary, phishing, skimming, hacking, and social engineering. James shared examples of the above scams and left us with these words of advice.

Safeguard your mail. A number of Rotarians have accessible mail boxes. Add a lock and kev.

Remove your name from mass marketing lists.

Safeguard your personal info. Keep your wallet secure. Don't carry social security numbers.

Don't make yourself the low hanging fruit is a good idea, whatever it means. Get a shredder.

Bad guys use skimmers to get credit card info at gas pumps. Use a pump closest to the office.

Monitor your Credit Reports. Go to Annual Credit Report.com. Look for address changes.

Use credit, not debit cards. (The bank picks up the tab if your credit card is compromised.)

Keep your anti-virus program updated.

Don't open e-mail from unknown sources. (If in doubt, right clicking on the name for more info.)

Inform the police, even if the problem seems minor.

It was indeed a stimulating and informative presentation by an outstanding member of our Police Department. As Obi Won would say, 'May the "force" be with you!'
