OANA MARCU introduced the speaker MARK WOLYNN, Director of the Family Constellations Institute in San Francisco, a leading expert in the field of inherited trauma and author of the book "It Didn't Start With You: How Inherited Family Trauma Shapes Who We Are and How to End the Cycle" (Viking/Penguin). The book is winner of the 2016 Nautilus Book Award in psychology, and has been translated so far in 18 languages. He





holds workshops internationally, including Australia, Costa Rica and MARK WOLYNN gave Canada. examples from his own practice, about specific patient cases related to OCD (obsessive compulsive disorder) and inherited fears that traced back to the generation of grandparents, and how to identify the cause and provide relief. He also provided examples from academic studies in the field of epigenetics. evidence supporting the that unresolved generational trauma

influences the offspring both from the mother and father side. ROB LANCEFIELD, LEE LIPPERT, HENRIETTA BURROUGHS and RALPH ADAMS asked very pertinent questions regarding post traumatic stress disorder and post traumatic growth, and the deeper social implications of birth and war trauma. Copies of MARK WOLYNN's book provided by Mountain View BOOKS INC's representative JENNY GORDON sold fully, and were signed by the author at the end of the talk.

Closing the meeting President GINNY acknowledged REBECCA GIRALDI and KATIE SEEDMAN for cashier support, STEVE MADSEN and RICHARD KELLER for set-up, and TOM GRACON and MIKE MCMAHON for handling the microphones for the audience.
