Prof. Pennington started with, "The 21st Century will be the most consequential century in human history, thanks to exponential growth of computers and Al." creativity changing the world."] Pennington said: "Design is the combination of art and science." "Design is envisioning, engineering and making of things that people use, or live in, or work with." "Good design requires Beauty, Strength and Utility." "Climate change will force us re-design everything in the next 30 years."
