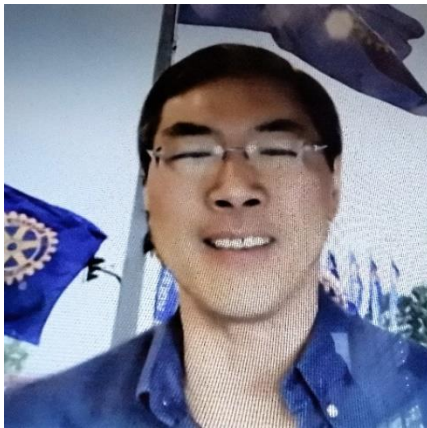

PLANS FOR FUTURE MEETINGS: DANA announced that we will continue virtual meetings indefinitely.

HENRIETTA noted that President Trump just asked no more than 10 people get together at time, and REBECCA announced that in California a shelter-in-place order will go into effect tonight at midnight. Only essential businesses will be allowed to continue operation. Jack Higgins noted that the CDC now says two months is length of their 10-person restriction on meetings.

PROGRAM – BRUCE GEE, The Annual Crab Feed Alternative Plan



There was no financial liability incurred when we cancelled the event. The room rent was refunded, and Ada's and the crab supplier did not charge for cancellation. The crab feed is the main source of funds for our annual charities, so its cancellation leaves us well below our normal for this time of year. Here is how the committee and board

hope to fill the gap:

- This year's Fund-a-Need charity is Ecumenical Hunger Project. Fund-a-Need comes out of the current year budget. Usually, this happens when donations made at the Crab Feed go directly to the charity. This year, the Board decided to take \$10,000 from existing funds for the Fund-A-Need charity so that we don't have to wait for direct contributions.

- We have received \$31,000 in sponsorships and hope all of them will convert those to donations.

- People who have bought tickets are changing those to donations.

- Plan to ask members to donate the amount they would have contributed to the Fund-A-Need and their ticket to the Crab Feed. Hoping to raise \$10-15,000 in these donations.

- PATTY McGUIGAN has offered at \$10,000 DICK BUSH matching fund for donations.

- Will organize an online auction. Hoping to raise another \$10-20,000 through the auction.

- Stretch goal is \$75,000 from all sources.
