
President Ben belled the meeting to order at 12:30.

CHARITABLGRANTS COMMOTTEE: BILL JOHNSON presented an overview and

encouraged members to consider

joining the committee which has 12-14 participants. They meet three times a year, beginning in December when they request nonprofits to submit one-page applications stating what a Rotary grant would fund. Usually, 50-70 groups apply. Fifteen semi-finalists are invited to submit full proposals. In January



those proposals are researched and evaluated, including site visits. Due to the pandemic, Zoom visits with executive directors and selected staff or people who would benefit from the grant will be the norm. Each committee member leads the evaluation process for one applicant. In February, the committee decides how to allocate \$50-60,000 in grants, ranging from \$2,000 to \$10,000 to 7-10 groups a year. BILL emphasized the joy of giving money away to nonprofit groups. Contact BILL if interested in joining the committee.
