


Speaker next Monday, March 22nd, will be Arlene Blum, Mountaineer and Founder of Green Science Policy Institute, speaking on "Breaking Trail: Mountains and Molecules."

TODAYS SPEAKER: DIANA DIAMOND introduced JUDGE STEVEN MANLEY, Supervising Judge of the

Santa Clara County Mental Health Treatment Court. He led the way to the establishment of our **County Mental Health Treatment** Court. It's the first Mental Health Treatment Court anywhere in the United States, and the "gold similar standard" of courts



anywhere. 40% of the homeless are mentally ill. Jailing



them makes their illness worse. Court hearings with mental health professionals. and wise and knowledgeable iudaes. increases the chances the defendant will actually get the counseling help he or she needs, instead of the usual revolving door experience that wastes lives

and money. Great patience is required of the judge and court personnel to help the homeless make what seem like even the simplest decisions to change a life's patterns. But often the defendant does change his decisions toward more healthy outcomes.

At the conclusion his talk, Judge Manley was asked if he would furnish a link to his slides, which were excellent, informative and impossible to summarize meaningfully in this limited report. Judge Manley agreed. Details will be available to members when slides are received.
