JIM SUTHERLAND introduced our speaker, Sandy Rosenthal, founder of Levees.org.

After Hurricane Katrina and the levee breaches in New Orleans, Sandy Rosenthal became a citizen investigator and founder of the non profit Levees.org with 25,000 supporters nationwide. Her new

book—Words Whispered in Water—is about how she led an investigative team that exposed the culprit in the levee breach disaster—the Army Corps of Engineers—and how the agency spent millions covering up its mistakes. Sandy Rosenthal is an advocate for the 62% of the American population living by levees.



According to Sandy, to save money, the Corps, an elite branch of the US Army, allowed the levees to be built with steel levee walls that did NOT go deep enouah to reach "bedrock." When the Hurricane Katrina floods overtopped the levees. they folded and collapsed. In other words.

collapsing of the levee walls was easily foreseeable. The Corps tried to blame everyone else, taking no responsibility for its own failures. In stark contrast, the levees built in the 1920's and 1930's [in the Kansas City and St. Louis areas] by the Corps of Engineers have withstood comparable flooding and levy pressures. Even though "Lives were at stake."

PRESIDENT CASH thanked Sandy Rosenthal for a well-done presentation.
