MIKE REYNOLDS, CHAIR OF THE WORLD COMMUNITY SERVICE



(WCS) STATED THAT HE KNEW HE HAD BIG SHOES TO FILL DURING HIS SECOND YEAR IN OUR CLUB. HE SALUTED WALT HAYS' LONG TENURE LEADING THE COMMITTEE AND FOLLOWED BY TIM WATSON. HE

LOOKS FORWARD TO LEARNING MORE ABOUT WCS, STATING THAT HE JOINED ROTARY SPECIFICALLY TO PARTICIPATE IN INTERNATIONAL SERVICE. HE NOTED THAT ROTARY IS NOT MYOPIC SINCE THE ROTARY MAP COVERS THE WORLD TO PROMOTE SERVICE ABOVE SELF. HE WONDERED WHY HE HAD WAITED SO LONG TO JOIN ROTARY.

HE EXPLAINED THAT HALF OF WCS FUNDING PROVIDES SMALL, LOCAL GRANTS WHILE THE OTHER HALF SUPPORTS WORLD-WIDE GRANTS. THE ROTARY FOUNDATION CONTRIBUTIONS HELP: FIGHT POLIO; PROMOTE WORLD PEACE AND UNDERSTANDING; FIGHT DISEASE; PROMOTE CLEAN WATER AND SANITATION; SUPPORT LOCAL ECONOMIES AND MOTHERS AND CHILDREN; AND PROTECT THE ENVIRONMENT. HIS COMMITTEE CURRENTLY HAS 20 MEMBERS.

MIKE PRESENTED CURRENT PROJECTS: MOBILE DENTAL UNIT IN CHILE (WHICH CONTINUED OPERATION DURING COVID-19) TRANSFERRED TO CUPERTINO; PROJECT ALESI, DRILLING FOR GROUND WATER IN KENYA, ALSO TRANSFERRED TO CUPERTINO; ESPERANZA JUVENIL IN GUATAMALA, WITH PALO ALTO IN THE LEAD IN 2021 UNDER TIM WATSON'S GUIDANCE, FOCUSES ON ENGLISH LANGUAGE SKILLS AND STEM TO REDUCE THE DISPARITY BETWEEN FEMALE AND MALE STUDENTS AND TO PROMOTE THE POTENTIAL OF FEMALE STUDENTS.

ALBERTO SOLANO, PRESIDENT OF AGROS, PRESENTED THE HEALTHY START PROJECT TO ADDRESS CHRONIC, CHILD MALNUTRITION IN CENTRAL AMERICA. PALO ALTO WILL LEAD THE PROJECT IN 2022-2023. AFTER 30 YEARS OF CIVIL WAR AND WITH 82% OF THE POPULATION POOR, THE PROJECT FOCUSES ON: PRENATAL CARE (INCLUDING NUTRITION TO PREVENT LOW-WEIGHT BABIES); HEALTHY EATING TO PREVENT MALNUTRITION; DAYCARE TO HELP DEVELOP

HEALTHY BRAINS AND THINKING SKILLS IN CHILDREN; AND MENTORING FOR MOTHERS WHO CAN LEARN TO WORK OUTSIDE THE HOME.

WITH NO FOLLOW-UP QUESTIONS, HENRIETTA BURROUGHS COMMENDED THE POSITIVE GOVERNMENT SUPPORT OF AND FOCUS ON THE LOCAL VILLAGE LEVEL.

PRESIDENT CASH COMMENDED THE WCS PRESENTATION. HE REMINDED MEMBERS TO SUPPORT THE ROTARY FOUNDATION DRIVE FOLLOWED BY THE ENDOWMENT FOCUS NEXT WEEK, AS WELL AS OUR CENTENNIAL YEAR PLANNING.
