The Grants Committee will meet on Dec 7. Let BILL JOHNSON know if you want to join the committee. This year 56 organizations submitted applications requesting a total of \$433,000. Our budget is \$55,000, which comes from charitable contributions and from proceeds from the endowment.

The Endowment Goal this year is to raise \$100,000 that will be matched by the pledges of 5 Rotarians: DUANE KALAR has pledged \$50,000; PATTY MCGUIGAN, and BRUCE SWENSON and ROGER SMITH have pledged a combined \$35,000; and DANA TOM has pledged \$15,000. ROGER SMITH announced his pledge, noting that it is a gift that keeps on giving. The endowment currently puts out about \$50,000 every year for our charities. PROGRAM: Long Term Member Talks. JIM SUTHERLAND introduced the lineup of stellar speakers: BILL FOGARTY, a member of our club for 38 years; RALPH ADAMS, with us for 31 years; and MIKE COUCH, a member of 25 years.



BILL FOGARTY is a San Francisco native with family lines going back to Prussia, Scotland and England. He grew up in a house that his parents paid \$12,000 for, and attended San Francisco schools, making childhood friends that he still keeps in touch with. Both of his parents worked in their

music store, which also provided the first "employment" for Bill, starting at age 7 – "wages", even through college, were generally in the form of records. Bill attended the University of San Francisco where he majored in accounting and was in ROTC. He also met Janet and her plans to become a nun were cast aside for love. In one very special year, Bill was commissioned in the military in May, graduated in June, married in June, and discovered he would be a father in July! After his military service, he went into accounting. He joined our club in 1983. His wife is a Millbrae Rotarian, past mayor, and she continues to work as an attorney, while Bill is retired. They love to travel and have visited over 40 countries.

RALPH ADAMS graduated from West Point just when the Vietnam



war building up and there was concern that communism would take over the world. Ralph wanted to help the cause, and he joined the Air Commando because their mission was not to kill people but to help them with services and aid. He never went to Vietnam, but filled his tour of duty. When he left the military, he knew he

wanted ultimately to start his own business. He took a job with a construction and development company because he liked the culture and saw opportunities for personal growth. He got a contract in Crossville, Tennessee and helped set up a Rotary club that is still going. A friend invited him to join a construction firm in the Bay Area, and he joined the PA Rotary in 1974. Ralph has been club President and he raised money for the club by taking pledges for his climb of Mt. Kilimanjaro. He has formed several companies in construction management and commercial real estate. Over the past 15-20 years he has handled school project management and inspection. (If ever there is an earthquake, schools are the safest place to be!) Having started many businesses during his life, even Ralph does not know what will be next.

MIKE COUCH is a San Francisco native, having been born in the



same hospital as now 6 generations of his family. A freckled young Michael Douglass Couch charmed us all as he looked out from the photo taken at the fancy hotel that he loved visiting with his grandparents. Mike's father learned how to build houses by books and built over 100 houses over the years. Mike went to Palo Alto schools, and his employment during childhood and college was for his dad, doing construction.

After college, Mike worked for his father's company, and then took a job at Coldwell Banker in commercial real estate. He has been involved in developing homes, commercial centers and apartments. Now he is part of Couch Investments with 3 generations of ownership – Mike, his children, and grandchildren. He and his wife Jean have traveled to 6 continents and 50 countries, the most unusual of which was Papua New Guinea. He joined Rotary in 1996, has been club President, done international projects, participated in Rotaract at Stanford, and in many other aspects of the club's service arms. MIKE also is heavily involved in a variety of community projects.
