WORLD COMMUNITY SERVICE: UKRAINE

The gravity of the invasion of Ukraine has shocked the world and particularly resonated with Rotarians. In Ukraine we can count over 50 Rotary Clubs with approximately 1000 members. The earliest Rotary Club in Ukraine was formed before World War II and clubs were formed in Kyiv as recently as 2019. **JOOP VERBAKEN** announced our WCS committee has provided \$5000 to Palo Alto's Neighbors Abroad organization in support of their **Ukraine Emergency Children's Relief Fund**.

Stanford. He is a

1976 graduate of

Stanford University with a bachelor's in economics. His career affiliations include membership: American Academy of Diplomacy, Council on Foreign Relations, Eurasia Foundation, Global Zero, Nuclear Security Working Group.

Presenting on the Russian invasion of Ukraine he reviewed the motivations of the largest military invasion in Europe since 1945. His perspective of these events centered on Putin's positioning of Russia versus Nato, the geopolitical strategy combined with incursion of Crimea and his domestic political goal of creating anti-western sentiment within Russia. Stating this was a war of choice the former ambassador noted the miscalculation of the strength of Ukrainian resistance and resilience, the negative impact of corruption in building Russian military strength and the effectiveness of economic sanctions from the West.

Former Ambassador Pifer had positive reviews of President Biden's diplomacy efforts despite missteps and shared that whatever the outcomes Putin has diminished Russia on the world stage while only serving to create his own economic damage.
